Hello TBE Families!

Each week, I Skype with my chevruta, my student partner, a friend and classmate in Pennsylvania. We started studying the minor prophets, twelve relatively short prophetic books that we as Reform Jews too rarely read. So far, we have read Hosea, Joel, Amos, and Obadiah.

In between these works, to change it up, we study Talmud. A former professor, the late Rabbi Aaron Panken, z"l, shared with us the results of a 2008 survey asking various Jewish scholars and professionals to identify the most important Talmudic discussions "that every educated Jew ought to know." They came up with 82 discussions, and we have been working our way down the list.

This week, we studied an excerpt from tractate Beitzah. The Hebrew word beitzah means "egg." The ancient rabbis wrote an entire treatise all about eggs, then a second treatise commenting on the original! The very notion of a roomful of rabbis engaging in heated discussions about eggs brings a smile to my face. That said, I cannot say I was enthused to study this particular text. Someone thought it important, though, so I tried to keep an open mind.

To my surprise and delight, we found these mere five paragraphs, ostensibly about the legal status of a particular egg, to be insightful, relevant, and engaging. It reminded me of the value of consciousness and intentionality, that even our smallest actions may have big consequences. My chevruta and I filled our 60 minutes. We read; we questioned. We asked; we answered. We debated; we found consensus. At various points, each of us played the role of teacher and student. We ate up our entire hour, and we could have kept going.

This episode, just one in a series of weekly seasons, illustrates the power and potential of the study of Judaism and Jewish text. No matter my initial skepticism, every session delivers incredible value.

As we close our first month of school and look forward to many more wonderful months this year, I hope we all find the same surprise, the same joy, and the same delight in our Judaism as my friend and I found in this passage. I will never again doubt the incredible, edible egg.

This past High Holy Days, I did something a bit different: I gave a short address at the Family Service Yom Kippur morning. As part of my bulletin article, I thought I would include what I said so the rest of the community could get some ideas about how to be a part of TBE. At the end of this article, I highlight some activities individuals and our congregation can participate in as part of our Sanctuary status to help undocumented immigrants and refugees currently in our area.

It is customary for the President of the Board to address the congregation on Erev Rosh Hashanah to give a state of the Temple address and outline what is coming up in the new year. What I realized last year was that this meant you all might not get to hear from the President at all. So, I asked if I could address you all at Family services this year.

So, first, on behalf of the Board, a warm welcome to our TBE families, both young and seasoned. I know many of you have enjoyed the Family service for many years—even well beyond your children needing a shorter, more truncated service.

This is my third year of a 3-year term as president, so I turn over the reins to Joe Pollak at the end of next June. Joe is incredibly talented and is raising a young family as many of you are. With a new rabbi, director of education, executive director, and new-ish cantor, it is time that the next generation take these reins. I raised my children in the Bob, Annie, Terri era. My daughter is now the 3rd grade teacher for Hebrew and religious school at TBE. (Yes, yes, she's the one with the purple hair!)

You will raise your children in the Josh, Regina, Daniel era. This is an amazing team—they are kind, energetic, thoughtful, hard-working individuals. They know the challenges in front of them and will make sure that TBE continues to have strong educational and youth programs, a variety of spiritual experiences, and always, always a warm and welcoming home. All this so that someday your child may teach the 3rd grade class (with or without purple hair).

And what is your role in all of this? As a child psychologist, I am well aware of the most powerful learning tool out there—role modeling. Our children who are well-cared for and well-loved are watching us. They watch us all the time. They observe what we do and say. These are the values we want our children to embrace; the love we give them is the glue that makes those values stick. So, what do you value about Judaism? What do you want your children to value? Jewish prayer and ritual? You are here with them, celebrating the most holy of days, but what about Shabbat? How about taking up one new tradition around Shabbat this year? Come to services once a month, or light the candles in your home.

Jewish learning and education? Yes, you bring them to religious school, but do you drop them off and leave? Come help out in a classroom, eat a bagel with the Brotherhood, take a Monday night class for yourself as an adult learner—after all, if they have to go to Hebrew and religious school don't you as well?

Gemilut chasadim? Acts of loving kindness—this year, when you fill up your bag for Food Gatherers for Yom Kippur, take your child to the store with you and have him or her pick out the food to put in the bag (you can do this every week to provide food for our Back Door Food Pantry). Go to the dollar store with your child and fill a bag with toiletries, socks, and personal items for someone in a homeless shelter. Bring those items here to TBE. This month TBE and St. Clare's will be participating in a joint toiletry drive for the refugee families sponsored by our Jewish Family Service. Volunteer at Alpha House with your child—it's a homeless shelter for families, and children are always welcome to play with the children in the shelter in the evening.

Kehillah? Connecting to your community? Join one of the many committees at TBE: membership, pulpit, religious education, finance, development, social action. Just call the Temple office to find out who chairs each of these groups and when they meet. Or, join the fun Women of TBE and enjoy a lunch out one day, or the Brotherhood—they need help putting up the Sukkah every year right after Yom Kippur (and, frankly, their backs are not getting any younger)!

Or volunteer some time in the front office—we can always use the help writing thank you notes and sending out materials.

Join our caring community group—visit the sick, make a meal, offer a ride to someone who has a doctor's appointment, or go to the home of the bereaved.

And, tell your child that you do these things because you are a Jew, because you value learning and ritual and spirituality and community and kindness—because you are a Jew. To learn more about our Sanctuary Movement Update visit the Social Action page on the TBE website.

These are your values. Love your children well. Show them that you love your Jewish community and TBE as well.

The Genesis Annual Meeting was held on Sunday, June 10. We heard reports regarding revisions to the Genesis bylaws and updates to the building over the past year, formally approved the 2018-2019 budget, and honored two outgoing board members: Gail Jungbluth, who finished her term in January, and Mark Davis-Craig, who finished his term in June. For more details, you can check out the annual report online, if you haven't already seen it.

New officers were elected at a brief meeting after the annual meeting. The new Genesis Board Officers are Murray Rosenthal (President, TBE), Jack Petersen (Vice-President, STC), Roger Palay (Treasurer, TBE), and Jim Downward (Secretary, STC). Continuing board members are Christine Modey (STC), Lisa Pershke (TBE), Ken Cook (STC vestry liaison), and Susan Gitterman (TBE board liaison). Rabbi Josh Whinston and the Rev. James Rhodenhiser are ex officio members of the board.

Following the annual meeting, the Genesis board, St. Clare's vestry, and Temple Beth Emeth's board met for the annual "Tri-Board Meeting." During this meeting, the boards heard brief updates from each congregation's leaders, then broke into small groups to discuss two questions:

1. If you had a magic wand, what improvements or updates would you make to our building?
2. What are the various ways in which we can raise revenue to meet the necessary repairs to our building, as well as to fulfill our hopes and dreams for this space?

The groups' ideas in response to these two questions were collected and collated. The Genesis board will discuss this input and use it to inform its priorities for capital expenditures and strategies for fundraising over the next few years.

Over the past months, the Genesis board has undertaken several building-related projects.

- We updated furniture in the gathering area and replaced window treatments in the social hall, thanks to generous donations.
- We replaced the sanctuary sound system.
- We resurfaced the parking lots.
- We signed a lease on a new copier and ensured both congregations can easily print to it using the network.
- We installed new carpeting in the hallway, several core-level classrooms, and the outer rings of the social hall.

Other projects are underway. We are currently in the process of updating the building WiFi, to better support a video doorbell system. As always, the board seeks ways to build relationships between the two congregations. Grounds Cleanup Day on April 29 and Mitzvah Day/Sunday of Service on June 3 brought congregants together to improve our shared property. Small dinners, of about a dozen members from both congregations, happen regularly. Recently, a duplicate bridge game has begun meeting on Tuesday evenings in the Core, attracting a couple dozen people. Although the game is ACBL "official" and open to the public, congregants are welcome and encouraged to participate. ### Solar Panel Investment Group

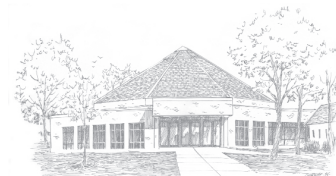
